Secretary's Report:

2000-13 Voted to approve secretary's report.

Committee Report's:

- A. Sub State/Local VOAD; South East VOAD is expanding it's membership. Meeting dates have been set for Davidson, Lawrence and Shelby county for their formation of a VOAD.
- B. Public Relations/ Promotional; We are needing to make a "boiler Plate" from each agency working with their P.I.O. We need to remake a service chart made up of all the agencies listing the resources and services that they can provide.
- C. Nominating; Alexander Lampkin, Gene Williams, and Will Rabert said they would be on the committee.
- 2000-15 Voted to accept the above names to be on the committee.

Program:

State Farm Insurance; "Recovering From the Unexcepted"

There are four areas. 1) Human Resource; Along with a 1-800 number they have a National Catastrophic Team that is available in 7 hours. Once they get up to a certain level of loss (numbers) there are line units that will come in for a 28 day tour. 2) Physical; Their centralized claim office is in Mississippi and Florida with 9 regular (daily) claim offices in Kentucky and 10 in Tennessee. 3) Financial; 4 billion total, 3 for any one event. They pay on fire -.42 cents on the \$1.00 and auto -.58 cents on the \$1.00 4) Education; Promote insurance at public affairs and high schools in using a 911 simulator and passing out brochures to help make a claim (what to do and how to do it). The biggest claim issue is hail.

TN. Department of Agriculture; "Procuring Water Supplies" John Sanford is the alternate emergency service coordinator. They are the lead public health agency in disasters. After the Carter Co. Disaster in East TN. (1998) the revamped the system. They have 25 water processors with output of 22,000 GPH with certify processors and container manufacturing at an out put of 100,000 GPH capacity. There is no money available for municipalities - get best price available (usually cost of processing). The

Department of Agriculture regulates the tanker industry. A tanker (semi) can carry 4,020 gallons but it's water is not approved for human consumption.

Distilled H20 has a shelf life of 6 years. Pasturized water is good for 6 months to 1 year. Stale water is ok to drink.

OLD BUSINESS:

- A) NVOAD Annual Conference; Three officers, President Bill Douglas, V. Pres. Terry Haight, Sect. Richard Ramey gave a talk on the different class that they had attended in Atlanta, GA. FEMA's James Lee Witt was a guest speaker. Plus a Home Depot representative.
- B) Membership Directory; We are still behind in getting this completed. We need all agencies to turn in this information
- C) Citizen To Citizen; The officers need to sign off on the legal papers.

NEW BUSINESS:

- A) Membership Dues; Change of dues was talked on, but will stand at \$100,000 for the year. This needs to be ratified at the February Annual meeting.
- B) A.R.C. Kitchen; There are 4 of these "Henry Kitchens" around the country. They are 75 feet in length and can produce 10,000 meals per day.
- C) Notification Protocol; Agencies need to remember the VOAD disaster plan so there are no short changes in notification.
- D) Disaster Child Care; Church of the Brethren can offer us a child care class if there is enough interest. More information is needed on accommodating the facilitator in housing and travel.

TRAINING DATES:

Baptist are having training in different fields at the 2 rivers church in Nashville the 19-20 January. And 30-31 in Linden, TN.

ACS is having Steps 1-2 in Johnson city the 2-3 December.
